#### Capital Project Update Rhinebeck Architecture – Phil Zemke

- Phase I
  - Window Contractor minor window punch list items RCK insulated panels at front entrance, by principal's office (still on order)
- Security
  - Originally, project was due to be completed December 2015, Diebold changed procurement. Daren is doing a rollout, project is still within budget.
- Phase II
  - Electrical punch list items are being completed
  - Mechanical and Plumbing Contracts have been closed out
  - Site contractor is completing re-seeding
- Budgets
  - > All projects remain within budget

### **New Capital Projects**

- John Jay High School Dug Outs
  - ➤ Contractor PVS has completed the dug outs; working on handicap path and paint the dug outs. Block was constructed in March during the warm spell in March 2016; concrete will take 27 days to cure. Work is being done 3 months ahead of schedule.
  - Contractor was given 2 options
    - Before Baseball season or after.
- Roy C. Ketcham High School Press Box and Concession Stand Replacement
  - Plans are still under review with SED; estimated review date is August 2016 with plans to go to bid in the fall of 2016
- James Evans Elementary Roof
  - > Starting roof in June; to be completed mid-August.
- District Wide CO<sup>2</sup> Detectors
  - Plans were delayed being submitted to SED due to added scope
  - > CO Sensors are monitored by the Building Management System in the main office.
  - The Committee questioned if there is a policy in place for or school level procedures? Ron said we can get that out.
  - > Boiler alarms are emailed to the Maintenance Mechanics, Supervisors and Ron Broas.
- Wappingers Junior High School Auditorium Abatement
  - > Contractor awarded the bid will Remove and abate floor tile including under the stage.
  - > Ron Broas and maintenance crew will install carpet to replace the tile
- 2015 Building Condition Survey
  - All data is entered online and is being reported to the SED
  - Jose has to give his approval
  - Each Survey is 27 pages
  - John Lumia would like a printed copy
- John Jay Water System Project
  - > Fellenzer Engineering is working on design they are doing a wide range of water testing.
  - This project is necessary due to the Dutchess County Department of Health not allowing the Wappingers Central School District to use a waiver for installing a chlorinating system.

#### Ron Broas, Director of WCSD Facilities & Operations

- Status of Modular Buildings at Van Wyck and Gayhead Elementary
  - There is a person interested in the Van Wyck Buildings
- Gayhead Modular Buildings can be removed after we find homes for Special Education.
- Phase I & II were \$1,000,000 under budget
- The Capital Committee agreed that they were impressed with the work that has been accomplished as an initial step. Van Wyck Junior High School looks beautiful, especially the sidewalks and floors; fabulous job
